The day-long event was an upbeat and fun-filled event that featured a DJ, and a photo booth, and served to bring the community together on a picturesque Dallas day – sunny, mid-80 degrees, and with low humidity.

"The CAPIS teamed was honored to participate in the National Day of Service by packing meals for the foodbank with non-profit organization 9/11 Day," began Chief executive Officer Ann Sebert. "It was a meaningful way to celebrate the lives of all who were lost on that tragic day, in addition to recognizing the efforts of the rescue and recovery personnel and those who answered the call for help in response to the attacks."
